3. Use technology as directed by adult in room	When using computers be on the directed websites. Absolutely no cell phone usage allowed. It should not be seen or heard.
4. Speak to others in a positive, professional and respectful manner	If you can't say anything nice don't say anything nice at all. Is it necessary? Is it helpful? If not, then best left unsaid.
5. For your safety and wellbeing:	We want you to be as safe as possible and able to learn in a clean and drama-free environment.

Class Expectations

Before class

- -Greet me at the door
- -Pick up all required materials
- -Start warm-up right away

During Class

- -Stay focused on task
- -Follow materials procedures
- -Keep area clean
- -Listen to instructions
- -No talking or getting up without permission

End of class

- -Put all materials back
- -Clean up your area
- -Stay in seat until bell
- -Take all your stuff with you

Consequences

If you break a rule you will receive:

- First offense: one verbal warning
- Second offense: A student-teacher conference will take place
- Third offense: Consequence including but not limited to Detention and your parent/guardian will be contacted

Additionally, all actions will be documented on a disciplinary referral

Dorchester County has a STRICT electronic policy. There is a designated area of the school where cell phone use is allowed. Any cellphone seen or heard WILL be confiscated, no exceptions. Any failure to comply will result in further disciplinary action.

Grading

All grades will fall into two categories: Summative (60%) and Formative (40%).

Summatives include, but are not limited to, tests, quizzes, projects, exit tickets and graded assignments. Assessments simply mean a tool to measure students' performance and/or skills.

Formatives will include, but are not limited to, classwork, group projects, online practice and journals.

Classwork

- If not done or completed, you will receive a .01 as a grade. All work is to be turned in on the day it is due. I will not accept any work past that day.
- If you are absent, check with the teacher and get the make-up work. You have up to 5 days (up to teacher's discretion) from the day you return to turn in your work. It is the students' responsibility to collect all make up work and notes necessary (this includes tests and quizzes). Grades will be entered in as a zero with a "missing" flag until work is made up.
- Tests and quizzes cannot be made up during class only after school or during lunch
