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Course Description *

An intermediate course in visual arts which focuses on students' analysis of how the visual arts interrelate with other forms of human creativity, such as the humanities and science. The course explores major forms of artistic expression including architecture, sculpture, painting, and other media from across a variety of cultures. This course is designed to explore <u>why</u> art is made, <u>not just how</u> art is made, and to appeal to students who enjoy art and history. Students will learn how artists contributed to and reflected the history of their time as well as how design concepts are used for visual expression and social commentary. Coursework will include performance assessments timeline, dream journal, etc.), short responses (artist statements, blogs, etc.) essays, small/large group discussions, cooperative learning activities, vocabulary activities, quizzes, and exams.

Course Requirements / Objectives *

- I. Analyze and Respond: Aesthetically
 - Discuss why certain art is made and interpret meaning
 - Study specific artists and their work to better understand historical reasons why it was produced
- II. Historical, Cultural, and Social Production
 - Understand art as a part of worldly cultural history
- III. Apply & Create
 - Apply knowledge and information to design, build, and create art
- IV. Evaluation & Criticism
 - Assess, describe, and question to self-evaluate and group critique of why art was made

Elements of Art: Line, Shape, Space, Value, Color, Form, Texture

Principles of Design: Harmony, Economy, Movement, Rhythm, Contrast, Proportion, Emphasis


Required Materials*

- Classes will also include worksheets, comprehension checks, critiques and short exercises.

Guidelines for Success *

VIRTUAL INSTRUCTION EXPECTATIONS:
